Secrets of Brač Private discovery of Brač Island followed by wine pairing lunch with chef Magdalena in Senjković Winery

In the morning hours, meet your guide and chauffeur for a private discovery of Brač island. Croatia's largest island is a world of its own, a rugged beauty with historic towns and villages, mysterious monasteries, and caves in the interior of the island. First, visit Škrip village - the oldest settlement on the island and one of the very few continuously inhabited localities in Europe.

Afterwards, visit the Jakšić family art atelier. The Jakšić Gallery in Donji Hmac on the island of Brač was opened in 2008 in the yard of the family house. This is the first open gallery of the Jakšić family, on the site of a rich family tradition. No visit to the island is complete without enjoying the view from the top of Vidova Gora, the highest peak of all Adriatic islands. What would be a better way to do so than taking a refreshing forest walk. Upon arrival to the top of Vidova Gora at 778 meters over the sea your guide will point to different islands and bays and guide you through amazing archipelago views but also allow some personal time so you can enjoy the view in peace.

Following the discovery, meet up with your chauffeur for a private transfer to the charming village of Nerežišća where we will be welcomed by the winemaker Senjković and his wife chef Magdalena. You will have the opportunity to taste their two Plavac varieties, Bosso and Bročko Rič, as well as the Plavac Mali rosé Spoza. Let Magdalena Senjković pamper you with her innovative cuisine, lunch perfectly paired with their wines.

These islands are located off the southwest coast of the island of Hvar, opposite the entrance to Hvar town. Pakleni Islands are a place of fun and some of the best restaurants and clubs off Hvar town.

Anchor in one of the bays or ACI Marina in Palmižana and enjoy the day swimming and snorkelling in the clear blue Adriatic or proceed and explore Hvar!

The island of Hvar is the only Croatian island regularly listed among the top 10 islands in the world! The sunny days, the surrounding crystal blue waters with nearby seductive islands, ancient villages, innumerable lavender fields, olive plantations and vineyards, enchanting stone streets and old Venetian palaces of the proud town of Hvar, are some of the reasons why everybody today is talking about Hvar! And what a glorious arrival! A storybook bay filled with gleaming yachts, sailing gullets and simple working skiffs, all crowned with a clifftop Venetian fortress surrounded by lush pines.



Explore the impressive Hvar Fortress, perched above the town, offering breathtaking views of the Adriatic Sea. The town's vibrant harbor, lined with yachts and traditional boats, provides a picturesque end to your tour, capturing the essence of Hvar's coastal charm.

Later in the day arrive in the picturesque fishermen town of Komiža or continue to historic Vis town and spend the night there. Either way, Vis island is a very special place with numerous great spots to discover! Local cuisine is known for fresh seafood and particularly local lobster and no meal on Vis should go without the great local *vugava* wine!

In the morning hours, explore Vis, Croatia's largest island in the Adriatic Sea, steeped in history from Neolithic times to Venetian rule.

Closed off after WWII as a military base, Vis now showcases clear waters and a rich marine life. Join a private tour to Tito's Cave and WWII remnants like the former runway and military tunnels. Visit ex-army bases, a submarine shelter, and a vineyard nestled in a reconstructed army tunnel.

During the day, enjoy a traditional Dalmatian seafood lunch.

Afterwards, return to your vessel, and enjoy the rest of your day at leisure.

Following breakfast, you will head towards beautiful Korčula island. Its first inhabitants, the Greeks, gave it the name Korkyra Melaina or 'Black Corfu' for its dense forests.

The island itself is rich in art and culture, as well as being remarkably beautiful for its unspoiled nature. The island is blanketed in green pines, with numerous tiny and secluded beaches and bays, ancient villages and hilltops that boast amazing panoramic views. The Moreška sword dance in Korčula town, as well as the sword dances of Kumpanija and Moštra in Čara, Pupnat and Žrnovo are as much rooted in the history and soul of the island, as are the brotherhoods which bind the community.

In the morning hours, meet your local guide who will take you on a discovery of Marko Polo's birthplace and roots with a twist – a scavenger hunt on the streets of Korčula following in Marco Polo's footsteps.

Charming Korčula town, its 1000 years of history surrounded by historic walls and towers, takes us back to the time of the Venetian Republic. Although a very compact town, the steep cobblestone alleys hold enough art and architecture and unique local culture to keep you enthralled at each turn. Traditional crafts and unsurpassed skills in stone masonry and shipbuilding that have made Korčula so beautiful are almost as legendary as its most famous world-traveling son, Marco Polo.

Afterwards, your guide will recommend a nice restaurant for lunch on your own.

Leave in the morning for Mljet Island National Park.

Mljet is the southernmost of the larger Adriatic islands. A large portion of the island is under protection as one of Croatia's most beautiful national parks. Forest-shrouded Mljet is one of the most seductive of all the Adriatic islands. The establishment of a national park in 1960 at its western end put the island on the tourist map, but Mljet is anything but overrun. Two deep bays filled with seawater, known as Malo Jezero and Veliko Jezero (Small Lake and Great Lake) are the best-known features of this park together with the historic monastery located on the island within Mljet island.

No visit to Mljet National Park is complete without seeing this unique place!

Exclusive tour of Pelješac Peninsula with Peka lesson, wine tasting and traditional lunch

In the morning, meet your host for today, renowned Croatian winemaker Mario Bartulović and embark on a private wine tour of Pelješac Peninsula!

The tour takes you along the ribbon of road that runs through the stunning landscape of the Peninsula. This is a superb opportunity to learn about the region, especially the art of winemaking, in the company of a true local who has carried on his family tradition.

First, visit the Miloš winery where you will have the opportunity to taste their famous Plavac Mali red wine. The next stop is the Grgich winery in Trstenik. Miljenko Grgich studied wine-making in Zagreb. After migrating to the US, with only \$20 in his pocket, he founded the famous Grgich Hills winery in Napa Valley but not before he made a name for himself being part of Chateau Montelena success story in the 70s! At the Grgich cellars, on top of hills overlooking the charming Trstenik harbour, you will taste their famous white Pošip and their red Plavac Mali Dingač.

Finally, you'll visit the 500-year-old wine cellar of the Bartulović family. By this time, it will feel like visiting a friend's house. Here you will enjoy a wine-tasting and traditional Croatian lunch, accompanied by their great wines!
